ISAIAH 6:1-13

MAIN TAKEAWAY

The promise in Scripture with the most blessings attached is *the fear of the Lord*. It's not about being afraid of God or angry at Him, it's about living in awe, reverence, and deep respect for who He is. The fear of the Lord is an attitude that leads to lasting transformation.

KEY SCRIPTURES

- **Isaiah 6:1-13 (KJV)**
 - **1-4** Isaiah saw the Lord.
 - **5-7** Isaiah saw himself.
 - **8-13** Isaiah saw his mission and purpose.
- **Ecclesiastes 12:13 (KJV)**

"Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this is the whole duty of man."

MAIN TAKEAWAYS

- The fear of the Lord is:
 1. **Recognizing** God's greatness, goodness and glory.
 2. **Responding** with our worship.
 3. **Relying** on Him, His plans and will for my life.
 4. **Receiving** transformation.
- The fear of the Lord brings:
 1. Transformation
 2. Freedom
 3. Self-discipline
- When you walk in the fear of the Lord, it conquers **every** other fear in your life.

ACTION STEPS:

1. Daily reverence and worship.

- Begin each day by acknowledging God's greatness and surrendering to His will. Engage fully in worship—don't spectate, participate. Let worship transform you.

2. Be a doer of the Word.

3. Live with purpose.

- Adopt an eternal mindset, this life is preparation for the next.

4. Surrender regularly.

- Like Isaiah, say, "Here I am, Lord. Send me." Practice daily submission to His plan.

REFLECT & REVISIT

- Go back and read Isaiah 6:1-13 and start seeking a revelation of who God is. Journal God's attributes, for knowing who He is, brings clarity about who you are.
